

## The Language Project Blog - Instructions

**Language:** Write an article in a language you love. Feel free to write in any language you feel comfortable expressing yourself.

**Style:** The article should be written in personal, informative style. Please try to avoid academic or journalistic style.

**Subject:** The subject of your article may concern any aspect of languages, linguistic professions or personal stories and experiences regarding languages.

**Proofreading:** The Language Project Team will proofread the articles and make any corrections if necessary, provided that the article is written in a language we know.

**Once you have chosen the subject you would like to write about, we kindly ask you to inform us about it before you start writing in order to avoid topics that have been already presented by other editors.**

Along with your article, we will also need:

- A short **summary** of your article (**150** characters ~ 1 - 2 sentences).
- **Images (1 - 3)** which you would like to be featured in your article (optional). *In case you don't want to find images for your article, our team will choose some images relevant to the subject of your article.*
- Please add **Hyperlinks** in your article if needed. If for example you are referring to Translation tool such as SDL TRADOS, add a link where the reader can be redirected for further information. *Our team will also make sure to add additional hyperlinks if needed.*
- A **short Bio of the editor (50-60 words)** in which you can write about your interests, your studies etc. Please keep in mind that the Bio should be written in informal style like a bio in a personal blog. Please provide us with your Bio both in Greek and English, if possible.
- **Your picture**, which will be published along with your short Bio and your contact details in your profile on our Network page. This way our readers will be able to get to know a bit more details about the editor of the article.
- **Your contact details:** Social media profiles, websites, blog, email address or anything else you would like to appear next to your picture on your profile page. *It's up to you to choose what you would like to appear in your profile page as contact details: only your email, only your website or blog, or all the above.*
